

# Katimma ish atta?

Where do you live?

Word meanings:

**katimma** – where      **ish** – you      **atta** – live, stay, reside

The pronoun '**ish**' always comes before a verb. Choctaw does not have a word for '**do**', however it is understood and inserted when translating to English.

Ex. Katimma ish ia? Where are you going?

**li** – I The pronoun '**li**' always comes after a verb.

Ex. Tumaha atta li. I live in town.

Hugo atta li. I live in Hugo.
