Vocabulary: **himitta** – to be young (of one)

Ohoyo himitta mvt chi hoyo.

That young lady is looking for you.

Mr. Parrish vt hattak himitta kiyo.

Mr. Parrish is not a young man.

Word Meaning:

ohoyo (o-hoh-yoh) = woman

himitta (hih-miht-tah) = to be young (of one)

mvt (maht) = that/those

chi (che) = you

hoyo (hoh-yoh) = to search or look for

vt (aht) = subject marker

hattak (haht-tahk) = man

kiyo (key-yoh) = not
