Vocabulary: **nanta** - what

Nanta isht ish vtta tuk? What were you doing?

Nanta ish katiohmi tuk? What did you do?

Nanta hosh chim akatiohmi? What's the matter with you?

Word Meaning:

nanta (nahn-tah) = what

isht vtta (esht aht-tah) = to be doing something

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker

katiohmi (kah-tioh-mih) = to do in some way

hosh (hohsh) = adverb marker

chim (chehm) = you
