

Lesson of The Day

Verb: hochefo - read

Holisso nanta ish hochefo?

What paper are you reading?

Hochefo la hinla.

I can read it.

Word Meaning:

holisso (hoh-lis-soh) = paper; book

nanta (nahn-tah) = what

li* (le) = I

hochefo (hoh-che-foh) = read

ish (esh) = you

ahinla (a-hehn-la) = can/may

***Note:** “li” changes to “la” when preceding a word beginning with the vowel “a.” Then, the “I” is stricken and the “a” moves into its place.
