The Cherokee and Choctaw are eating.

Word Meaning: **Chahta** (Chah-tah) = Choctaw

Chalaki (Cha-la-key) = Cherokee

yvt (yaht) = subject marker (the)

pvt (paht) = subject marker (this)

ohoyo (oo-hoh-yoh) = woman **impa** (ehm-pa) = eat

micha (meh-cha) = and **bvnna** (bahn-na) = want; need

anumpli (ah-nohm-poh-le) = speak/talk
