

Lesson of The Day

Noun: nan ishko – something to drink

Nan ishko kapussa chi bunna?

Do you want something cold to drink?
Would you like something cold to drink?

Ohoyo put nan ishko chompa tuk.

This lady bought something to drink.
OR -- This woman purchased drinks.

Word Meaning: **bunna** (bahn-na) = want/need

nan ishko (nahn esh-koh) = something to drink

kapussa (kah-pahs-sah) = cold **tuk** (tohk) = past tense

ohoyo (o-hoh-yoh) = woman **chi** (che) = you

chompa (chohm-pa) = buy/purchase

put (paht) = subject marker (this)

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
