Pronoun: kanimma - somewhere

Kanimma bohli li tuk.

I laid it somewhere.

Kanimma ia chi bunnho?

Do you want to go somewhere?

Word Meaning:

kanimma (ka-nim-ma) = somewhere

bohli (boh-lih) = put/place/lay(s)

li (lih) = I

chi (che) = you

tuk (tohk) = past tense

ia (e-yah) = go/going

bunna (bahn-nah) = want/need

ho (honh) = question marker
