

Lesson of The Day

Verb: ashachi – put/place/lay
(plural – 2 or more, several items or objects)

Um ilefoka katimma ish ashachi tuk?

Where did you put my clothes?

Chim aboha ashachi li tuk.

I placed them in your room.

Word Meaning:

um (ahm) = my **li** (lih) = I

ilefoka (e-lih-foh-ka) = clothes

katimma (ka-tim-mah) = where

ish (esh) = you **aboha** (ah-boh-ha) = room

ashachi (ah-sha-che) = put/place/lay (plural)

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker

chim (chehm) = your
