Noun: nita - bear

Nita mut nukoa.

That bear is mad.

Nita chito yut iti nuta ittonla.

The big bear is lying under the tree.

Word Meaning:

nita (nih-tah) = bear

mut (maht) = subject marker (that/those)

nukoa (noh-koh-wah) = mad/angry

chito (che-toh) = big/large

yut (yaht) = subject marker

iti (e-tih) = tree

nuta (noh-tah) = under

ittonla (it-tohn-la) = to be lying
