Possessive Pronoun: pim – our

Pim vlla yvt issuba ombinili bvnna.

Our child wants to ride a horse.

Chim vlla yvt pim ofi aiokpanchi.

Your child likes our dog.

Word Meaning: **issuba** (es-soh-bah) = horse

pim (pehm) = our **vlla** (ahl-la) = child

yvt (yaht) = subject marker

ombinili (ohm-bih-nih-lih) = to ride/to sit on

bvnna (bahn-nah) = want/need

aiokpanchi (eye-yohk-pahn-chih) = like (something)

chim (chehm) = your

ofi (o-fih) = dog
