Possessive Pronoun: *h̃chim* – your (all)

A katos vt h̃chim ofi aiokpanchi kiyo.

My cat does not like your dog.

H̃chim issi kosoma yvt kotoma.

You goat has a bad odor.

Word Meaning:

a (ahn) = my **kiyo** (key-yoh) = not

katos (kah-tohs) = cat **ofi** (o-fih) = dog

vt (aht) = object marker **yvt** (yaht) = subject marker

h̃chim (ha-chim) = your (all)

issi kosoma (es-sih koh-soh-ma) = goat

aiokpanchi (eye-yohk-pahn-che) = to like (something)

kotoma (koh-toh-mah) = having a bad odor
