Those two women have arrived.

Word Meaning:

vm (ahm) = my vlla (ahl-la) = child
micha (mih-cha) = and iki (ehn-key) = father
yvt (yaht) = subject marker
ittvlachi (et-tah-la-che) = two arrives
ohoyo (o-hoh-yoh) = women
tuklo (tohk-loh) = two
mvt (math) = subject marker
```
