Verb: ittʌlachi – two arrives

**ʌm ʌlla micha iki yʌt ittʌlachi.**

My child and her father have arrived.

**Ohoyo tuklo mʌt ittʌlachi.**

Those two women have arrived.

Word Meaning:

**ʌm** (ahm) = my      **ʌlla** (ahl-la) = child

**micha** (mih-cha) = and      **iki** (ehn-key) = father

**yʌt** (yaht) = subject marker

**ittʌlachi** (et-tah-la-che) = two arrives

**ohoyo** (o-hoh-yoh) = women

**tuklo** (tohk-loh) = two

**mʌt** (math) = subject marker

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
