Verb: owʋtta – hunt (animals)

Fʋni ish owʋtta ho?

Are you hunting squirrels?

ʋlla nakni mʋt issi owʋtta.

That boy is hunting deer.

Word Meaning:

fʋni (fah-nih) = squirrel

mʋt (maht) = subject marker (that/those)

ish (esh) = you

owʋtta (o-waht-tah) = hunt (animals)

ho (hohn) = question marker

ʋlla nakni (ahl-la nahk-nih) = boy

issi (es-see) = deer
