

Lesson of The Day

Location/Position: asha/ayasha – to be (exist/reside/live) - plural

Pokni i chukka okla asha.

They live in grandma's house.

Toksvli vhleha yvt holisso apisa aiyasha.

The workers are at the school.

Word Meaning: **pokni** (pohk-nih) = grandmother

i (ehn) = his, her, it

chukka (chohk-kah) = house

okla (ohk-la) = they/people

toksvli (tohk-sah-lih) = work

asha (ah-shah) = to be (exist/reside/live) plural

vhleha (ah-theh-ha) = plural

yvt (yaht) = subject marker

holisso apisa (hoh-lis-soh ah-pih-sah) = school

aiyasha (eye-yah-shah) = to be (exist/reside/live)
