Possessive Adjectives: pimmi – ours/belongs to us

Ofi chito yummvt pimmi.

That big dog is ours.

Akaka tuklo mvt pimmi kiyo.

Those two chickens do not belong to us.

Word Meaning: **akaka** (ah-kahn-kah) = chicken

ofi (o-fih) = dog

kiyo (key-yoh) = not

chito (che-toh) = big/large

tuklo (tohk-loh) = two

yummvt (yahm-maht) = that/those

pimmi (pihm-mih) = ours/belongs to us

mvt (maht) = that/those (short for yummvt)
