Word Formation: isht impa = eating utensils (fork, spoon)

 $\frac{1}{1}$ isht = instrument; with + $\frac{1}{1}$ impa = to eat → $\frac{1}{1}$ isht impa = eating utensils (fork, spoon)

Isht impa himona chompa tuk.

She bought new eating utensils.

Isht impa himona achefa li.

I am washing the new eating utensils.

Word Meaning: li (lih) = l

isht impa (esht ehm-pa) = eating utensils (fork, spoon)

himona (he-moh-na) = new

chompa (chohm-pa) = buy/purchase

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker

achefa (ah-che-fah) = to wash
