Vocabulary: hakshup – skin/shell/bark

Ahe hakshup vpa li.

I am eating potato skins.

Luksi i hakshup vt koa.

That turtle's shell is cracked.

Iti hakshup hokmi li.

I am burning tree bark.

Word Meaning: **li** (lih) = I

ahe (ah-he) = potato **i** (ehn) = his/her/it

hakshup (hahk-shohp) = skin/shell/bark

vpa (ah-pa) = eat **koa** (koh-wah) = cracked

iti (ih-tih) = tree/wood **luksi** (lohk-sih) = turtle

vt (aht) = subject marker

hokmi (hohk-mih) = to burn
