Vocabulary: halupa – to be sharp

Bashpo pvt halupa kiyo.

This knife is not sharp.

Isht holissochi halupa sv bunna tuk.

I wanted a sharp pencil.

Word Meaning: **kiyo** (key-yoh) = not

bashpo (bahsh-poh) = knife

pvt (paht) = this/these

halupa (ha-loh-pa) = to be sharp

isht holissochi (esht hoh-lihs-soh-chih) = pen/pencil

sv (sah) = I

bunna (bahn-nah) = want/need

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker
