

Lesson of The Day

Vocabulary: **hopohoni** – to continue cooking; to keep on cooking
Intensive Form: adding an extra ‘**h-o**’ to the word ‘**hoponi**’ shows continuous action.

Pilashash e hopohoni tuk.

Yesterday we kept cooking.

Ohoyo mvt hopohoni bvnna tuk.

That woman wanted to continue cooking.

Word Meaning: **e** (e) = we

pilashash (pih-lah-shahsh) = yesterday

hopohoni (hoh-poh-hoh-nih) = to continue cooking

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker

ohoyo (o-hoh-yoh) = woman

mvt (maht) = that/those

bvnna (bahn-nah) = want
