Vocabulary: **ihishko** – keeps on drinking

Base word – **ishko** – Lengthening the base word ‘**ishko**’ by adding an ‘**h**’ and a nasalized ‘**i**’ changes the verb meaning to show continuous action.

Nanta ish ihishko?

What do you keep drinking?

Oka ihishko li.

I keep drinking water.

Word Meaning:

nanta (nahn-tah) = what

ish (esh) = you

ihishko (ih-hihnsh-koh) = keeps on drinking

oka (o-kah) = water

li (lih) = i
