

# Lesson of The Day

Negation of the verb form ‘**h̄vchik-o**,’ means “**you, not.**” ‘**H̄vchik**’ is prefixed before a verb (**h̄vchik+verb**) and the last vowel of the word is converted to an ‘**o**,’ (**h̄vchik+verb+o**) unless the verb already ends in an ‘**o**,’ then it remains the same.

Base word: **haklo** = to hear (h̄vchik+haklo+o) → **h̄vchikhaklo** = you didn’t hear

Vocabulary: **h̄vchikhaklo** – you didn’t hear

**Hattak vt kania tuk a h̄vchikhaklo tuk o?**

**Did you all not hear that the man is lost?**

**Nana pima chi ka h̄vchikhaklo tuk o?**

**Did you all not hear what he said to us?**

Word Meaning: **hattak** (haht-tahk) = man

**vt** (aht) = subject marker

**kania** (kah-nih-yah) = lost

**tuk** (tohk) = past tense marker

**a** (ahn) = object marker

**h̄vchikhaklo** (ha-chihk-hahk-loh) = you didn’t hear

**o** (ohn) = question marker

**nana** (nah-nah) = anything

**pim** (pihm) = to or for us

**achi** (ah-chih) = said

**ka** (kahn) = a conjunction used when the subject is the same

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
