Keyuh* su yimmi!

I don't believe so!

Most commonly pronounced: **key-yoh* sammi** (as in the English short vowel sound in 'hat'.)

In today's usage, it is closer to the English expression "*I don't think so!*"

*a predicative -h is added to verbs when they are followed by certain kinds of adverbs.

Word meaning:

keyuh (key-yoh) = no; not

yimmi (yim-meh) = to believe

su (sah) = 'me' or 'I' – first person singular (used when speaking about things that cannot be separated from the speaker. Ex. Body parts, beliefs, emotions and kinship terms.)
