

Lesson of The Day

Vocabulary: **achefa ho** – while washing

ho: as/while – for adverbial clauses that have their own subject

Isht ishko ma achefa ho koa tuk.

That glass cracked while she was washing it.

Ampo achefa ho pula mosholi tuk.

The lights went out while she was washing dishes.

Word Meaning: **pula** (pah-la) = light

isht ishko (esht esh-koh) = cup/glass

ma (mahn) = that/those

achefa ho (ah-che-fah hohn) = while washing

koa (koh-wah) = crack

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker

ampo (ahm-poh) = dishes

yvt (yaht) = subject marker

mosholi (moh-shoh-lih) = to go out (as lights)
