

Lesson of The Day

Vocabulary: **balili ho** – while running

ho: as/while – for adverbial clauses that have their own subject

Hattak vt balili ho ofi yvt kopuli tuk.

The man was bitten by a dog while running.

Chukka pila pit balili ho pisa li tuk.

I saw him running toward the house.

Word Meaning: **hattak** (haht-tahk) = man

vt (aht) = subject marker **pila** (pih-la) = toward

balili ho (bah-lihn-lih hohn) = while running

ofi (o-fih) = dog **yvt** (yaht) = subject marker

kopuli (koh-poh-lih) = bite **pisa** (pihn-sah) = see

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker

chukka (chohk-kah) = house **li** (lih) = I

pit (pith) = that way (from speaker)
