**Possessive Pronoun - *vm* - my (use before nouns beginning with a vowel)**

| 6. Onnakma <i>a</i> kaa apoksia <i>chi</i> .     | He will repair my car tomorrow. |

*Possessive Pronouns - chi - your (use before nouns beginning with a consonant)*
