Vocabulary: **anowa** – to walk on; in

Kvta hosh lukchuk anowa tuk?

Who walked in the mud?

Ofi mvt na pakanli anowa hosh aya.

That dog is walking on the flowers.

Word Meaning: **ofi** (o-fih) = dog

kvta (kah-tah) = who

hosh (hohsh) = subject marker

lukchuk (lohk-chohk) = mud

anowa (ah-noh-wah) = to walk on; in

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker

mvt (maht) = that/those

na pakanli (nah pah-kahn-lih) = flower

aya (ahn-yah) = to be in motion (such as going along)
