Vocabulary: **waya** – to bear fruit

Takkon vpi mvt waya chi ho?

Will that apple tree bear fruit?

Iti mvt waya lawa.

That tree is bearing a lot of fruit.

Word Meaning:

takkon (tahk-kohn) = apple

vpi (ah-pih) = tree

mvt (maht) = that/those

waya (wah-yah) = to bear fruit

chi (chehn) = future tense marker

ho (hohn) = question marker

iti (ih-tih) = tree

lawa (lahn-wa) = a lot
