## Possessive Pronouns Chart

To show ownership, Choctaw has the –m form and nasalized form which always precedes the thing possessed.

nasalized form, prefixed before words that begin with a consonant.  
-m form, prefixed before words that begin with a vowel.

Examples: My – vm or a

vm issuba = my horse      a chukka = my house  
vm aboha = my room      a shulush = my shoes

Your – chim or chi

chim aboha = your room      chi katos = your cat  
chim abinili = your chair      chi chukka = your house
