Ma haklo li kv̄t sv̄ na yukpa. or **Na sv̄ yukpa.**

I am glad to hear that.

Nanta ish haklo?

What are you listening to? or What do you hear?

Is sv̄ haklo ha? Did you hear me?

Ak chi haklo tuk. I didn't hear you.

Word Meaning: **ma** (mah) = that

haklo (hahk-loh) = hear

li (lih) = I **sv̄** (sah) = I **ak** (ahk) = I, not

kv̄t (kaht) = conjunction used when same subject

na yukpa (nah yohk-pah) = happy

nanta (nahn-tah) = what

ish (esh) = you **is** (ess) = you **chi** (che) = you

ha (hahn) = past tense marker

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker
