Vocabulary: **oka** – water (4 of 5)

Chim ofi ya oka ipeta.

Water your dog.

Oka falama yvt chukka lawa okpani tuk.

The flood destroyed a lot of homes.

Word Meaning:

chim (chehm) = your

ofi (o-fih) = dog

ya (yahn) = subject marker

oka (o-kah) = water

ipeta (ih-pe-tah) = to feed

oka falama (o-kah fah-lah-ma) = flood

yvt (yaht) = subject marker

chukka (chohk-kah) = house/home

lawa (lahn-wah) = many **tuk** (tohk) = past tense marker

okpani (ohk-pah-nih) = to destroy

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker
