Vocabulary: **oka** – water (5 of 5)

Hattak mvt oka chaha oka nowa tuk.

That man waded high water.

Chibbak a isht ahchifa micha oka isht achefa.

Wash your hands with soap and water.

Word Meaning: **oka** (o-kah) = water

hattak (haht-tahk) = man/person

mvt (maht) = that/those (short form)

chaha (chah-ha) = high

oka nowa (o-kah noh-wah) = to wade

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker

chibbak (chihb-bahk) = your hands

a (ahn) = subject marker

isht ahchifa (esht ah-chih-fah) = soap

micha (mih-cha) = and

isht (esht) = with

achefa (ah-che-fah) = wash
