

# Lesson of The Day

**chi** = my -nasal form, prefixed before words that begin with a consonant.

**chim** = my -m form, prefixed before words that begin with a vowel.

## Chimafo yvt katimma bininli?

Where is your grandfather sitting?

## Chimafo yvt issi nipi bvnna.

Your grandfather wants to eat deer meat/ venison.

### Word Meaning:

**chimafo** (chim-ah-fo) = your grandfather

**yvt** (yaht) = subject marker      **bvnna** (bahn-na) = wants

**katimma** (ka-tim-ma) = where      **bininli** (bi-nin-li) = sitting  
**vpa** (ah-pa) = to eat (with named item

preceding it)      **issi nipi** (is-si ni-pi) = deer meat/ venison

### Base words for kinship terms:

**hvshki** = mother      **nakfi** = brother      **pokni** = grandmother

**iki** = father      **i tek** = sister      **mafo** = grandfather
