Possessive Pronoun: im - their

**Okla im anumpa yo anumpula chi.**

They will speak their language.

**Ohoyo moma kv̄t im v̄lla v̄hleha apela chi.**

All of the women will help their children.

**Word Meaning:** **okla** (ohk-la) = they/people

**im** (ehm) = their

**v̄lla** (ahl-la) = child

**anumpa** (ah-nohm-pa) = word/language

**yo** (yohn) = object marker

**apela** (ah-peh-lah) = help

**ohoyo** (o-hoh-yoh) = woman

**moma** (moh-mah) = all

**v̄hleha** (ah-theh-ha) = plural

**kv̄t** (kaht) = \_\_\_ of the \_\_\_

**achi** (ah-chehn) = future tense marker

**anumpuli** (ah-nohm-poh-lih) = speak/talk (in order to

Accommodate the future tense ‘**achi**,’ the ‘**i**’ is dropped and the ‘**a**’ moves over. E.g. “...**anumpula chi**...”
