Nanta hvsh katiohmi?

What are you (all) doing?

Hvsh taloa chi ho?

Are you (all) going to sing?

Word Meaning:

<mark>nanta</mark> (nahn-tah) = what

hvsh (hahsh) = you (all)

katiohmi (kah-ti-oh-mih) = do/doing

taloa (tah-loh-wah) = sing

chi (chehn) = future tense marker (from achi; the
'a' goes to the last letter of the preceding word)

ho (hohn) = question marker
