Possessive Pronouns: **chi** & **chim** – your

chi = your –nasal form, prefixed before words that begin with a consonant.

chim = your –m form, prefixed before words that begin with a vowel.

Chishke yvt katimma ia tuk?

Where did your mother go?

Chishke i hohchifo yvt nanta?

What is your mother's name?

Word Meaning: **ia** (e-ya) = go

chishke (chish-ke) = your mother

yvt (yaht) = subject marker

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker

katimma (kah-tihm-ma) = where

nanta (nahn-tah) = what

i hohchifo (ehn hoh-chi-foh) = her name
