

Lesson of the Day

Possessive pronoun: **his/ her/ their mother**

Ishki yvt chi hopona chi.

Their mom will cook for you.

Ishki yvt chunna.

Her mom is skinny.

im – m form, prefixed before words that begin with *vowels*

i – nasal form, prefixed before words that begin with *consonants*

Word Meaning: **ishki** (ish-ke) = his/ her/ their mother

yvt (yaht) = subject marker **chi** (che) = to or for you

chunna (chohn-nah) = skinny

hoponi (hoh-poh-ne) = to cook (changes to **hopona** for

future tense) **achi** (ah-ch^{ehn}) = future tense marker

Base word for mother = **hushki**

my mother = **svshki** your mother = **chishki**

his/ her/ their/ mother = **ishki**
