Possessive Adjective: ᵱmmi – mine/belongs to me

Holisso lusa mᵱt ᵱmmi.

That black book is mine.

Shulush pᵱt ᵱmmi kiyo.

These shoes are not mine.

Word Meaning: **pᵱt** (paht) = this/these

holisso (hoh-lis-soh) = book/paper

lusa (loh-sah) = black

mᵱt (maht) = that/those

ᵱmmi (ahm-mih) = mine/belongs to me

shulush (shoh-lohsh) = shoe/shoes

kiyo (key-yoh) = not
