micha (me-chah) = and pokni (pohk-nih) = grandmother

yvt (yaht) = subject marker katos (kah-tohs) = cat

kucha (koh-chah) = outside

chiya (chehn-yah) = to be sitting

tuklo (tohk-loh) = two kaa (kah) = car

mvt (maht) = those

pakna (pahk-na) = on top of
```
