

Lesson of The Day

Location/Position: hinli – to be standing (dual)

Issi tuklo mvt impa hosh hinli.

Those two deer are standing there eating.

Ofi tuklo mvt aiimpa nuta hinli.

Those two dogs are standing under the table.

Word Meaning: **issi** (his-see) = deer

tuklo (tohk-loh) = two **ofi** (o-fih) = dog

mvt (maht) = subject marker (that/those)

impa (ehm-pah) = eat **nuta** (noh-tah) = under

hosh (hohsh) = subject/adverb marker

hinli (hihn-lih) = to be standing (dual)

aiimpa (eye-ehm-pa) = table
