Location/Position: ashwa – to be, temporary (dual)

Pokni micha mafo yvt chukka ashwa.

Grandma and grandpa are at home.

Ahoponi ashwa tuk.

They were in the kitchen.

Word Meaning:

pokni (pohk-nih) = grandmother

micha (mih-chah) = and

mafo (ma-foh) = grandfather

yvt (yaht) = subject marker

chukka (chohk-kah) = house

ashwa (ahnsh-wah) = to be, temporary (dual)

ahoponi (ah-hoh-poh-nih) = kitchen

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker
