Dialogue Lesson 3 of 5: **Chi hohchvffo ho?**

A previous lesson asked “**Chi hohchvffo ho?**” (are you hungry?) This lesson answers that question.

The use of ‘**chi**’ also means ‘**you**’ and is in the second person singular form. This usage shows how ‘**you – chi**’ is affected by an action or adjective.

Keyu, sv hohchvffo kiyo.

No, I am not hungry.

Word Meaning: **keyu** (ke-yoh) = no

hohchvffo (hoh-cha-foh) = hungry

sv (sah) = I am **kiyo** (ke-yoh) = not

‘**Sv**’ is a possessive personal pronoun used when referring to emotions, some family relationships and body parts. It can be translated as ‘**my**’ and ‘**I am**’ when describing emotions or state of mind.
