

Lesson of The Day

Vocabulary: **nukowa hosh** - angrily

hosh - manner usually ends with -ly for adverbial clauses that modify the subject

ᵛlla mvt nukowa hosh im ofi habli tuk.

That child angrily kicked her dog.

Hattak chaha mvt nukowa hosh ᵛm anumpuli tuk.

That tall man spoke angrily to me.

Word Meaning: **ᵛlla** (ahl-lah) = child

mvt (maht) = that/those

nukowa hosh (noh-koh-wah hohsh) = angrily

im (ehm) = to or for him, her, it

ofi (o-feh) = dog **habli** (hob-lih) = kick

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker

hattak (haht-tahk) = man **chaha** (chah-ha) = tall

ᵛm (ahm) = to or for me

anumpuli (ah-nohm-poh-lih) = speak or talk
