Dialogue Lesson 2 of 3: **Tumaha ish ia chi ho?**

A previous lesson asked “**Tumaha ish ia chi ho?**”
(Will you be going to town?)

***Chih kasha.**

Probably will.

*a predicative ‘h’ is added to verbs when they are followed by certain adverbs

The full meaning of this expression is: **Yohma chih kasha.**

It will probably be so (in that manner).

Word Meaning:

chi (ch^{ehn}) = future tense (from **achi**)

kasha (k^{ahn}-sha) = probably, likely to happen

Note: underlined vowels are nasalized
