Ish <u>i</u> yimmi h<u>a</u>?

Did you believe him/her?

Keyu, ak <u>i</u> yimmo tuk.

No, I did not believe him/her.

Keyu, <u>i</u> sv yimmi tuk kiyo.

No, I did not believe him/her.

Word Meaning: ak (ahk) = I not sv (sah) = I

ish (esh) = you i (ehn) = to or for him/her/it

yimmi (yihm-mih) = to believe keyu (key-yoh) = no

yimo (yihm-o) = not believe kiyo (key-yoh) = not

tuk (tohk)/ha (hahn) = past tense marker
