

Lesson of The Day

Vocabulary: **iba/ ibai** – with him/ her/ it

iba = used before verbs that begin with a *consonant*

ibai = used before verbs that begin with a *vowel*

Ish iba hoponi tuk o?

Did you cook with her?

Ibai impa la chi.

I will eat with her.

Word Meaning: **ish** (esh) = you

iba (ih-bah) or **ibai** (ih-bye) = with him/her/it

hoponi (hoh-poh-nih) = cook

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker

o (o^{hn}) = question marker

impa (ehm-pah) = eat

li (lih) = I

achi (ah-chehn) = future tense marker

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
