

Lesson of the Day

Indirect Objects: **ch_i/chim** – to or for you

chim – m form, prefixed before words that begin with *vowels*

ch_i – nasal form, prefixed before words that begin with *consonants*

Ohoyo pvt ch_i taloa bvnna.

This woman wants to sing for you.

Ch_i hoponi tuk o?

Did she cook for you?

Word Meaning: **ohoyo** (o-hoh-yoh) = woman

pvt (paht) = this/these **ch_i** (ch^{ehn}) = to or for you

hoponi (hoh-poh-nih) = cook

taloa (tah-loh-wah) = sing

bvnna (bahn-nah) = want/need

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker

o (o^{hn}) = question marker
