

# Lesson of the Day

Indirect Objects: **chi/chim** – to or for you

**chim** – m form, prefixed before words that begin with *vowels*

**chi** – nasal form, prefixed before words that begin with *consonants*

**Chi ho<sub>i</sub>poni tuk o?**

Did she cook for you?

**Aka<sub>a</sub> nipi chi ho<sub>i</sub>poni tuk o?**

Did she cook chicken for you?

**Word Meaning:**

**aka<sub>a</sub> nipi** (ah-k<sup>ahn</sup>-kah ni-pe) = chicken

**chi** (ch<sup>ehn</sup>) = to or for you

**ho<sub>i</sub>poni** (hoh-poh-nih) = cook

**tuk** (tohk) = past tense marker

**o** (o<sup>hn</sup>) = question marker
