Vocabulary: **ikbi** – to make (food, toy, craft), build (something)

Nanta ish ikbi tuk?

What did you make?

Um vlla ya nan isht washoha im ikbi li tuk.

I made a toy for my child.

Berdie ya banaha im ikbi li tuk.

I made banaha for Berdie.

Word Meaning: **banaha** (bah-nah-ha) = shuck bread

nanta (nahn-tah) = what **li** (lih) = I

ish (esh) = you **ikbi** (ihk-bih) = to make; build

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker **um** (ahm) = my

vlla (ahl-lah) = child **im** (ehm) = for him, her, it

ya (yahn) = object marker

nan isht washoha (nahn esht wah-shoh-ha) = something to play with (toy)
