Vocabulary: **bvshli** – to cut, slash, slice

Hattak tuklo mvt iti bvshli hosh ashwa.

Those two men are cutting wood.

Sue vt nipi bvshli tuk.

Sue sliced the meat.

Word Meaning:

hattak (haht-tahk) – man

tuklo (tohk-loh) – two

mvt (maht) = that/those (short form of yummut)

iti (ih-tih) = tree, wood

bvshli (bahsh-lih) = to cut, slash, slice

hosh (hohsh) = adverb

ashwa (ahnsh-wah) = dual (to be temporary)

vt (aht) = subject marker

nipi (nih-pih) = meat

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker
